

About Schoolreaders

Did you know:

- One in four children left primary school in 2017 unable to read to the required standard.
- Around 5.8 million people in England and Northern Ireland (that's 16% of all adults) score at the lowest level of proficiency in literacy. This means they are unable to read a medicine label, follow a timetable, or interpret simple written instructions.
- Unemployed adults are twice as likely to have weak literacy skills as those in full-time employment.
- Almost half of people going to prison (46%) have literacy skills lower than those expected of an 11 year old. And a quarter of young offenders have reading skills below those of the average 7-year-old.

Schoolreaders provides
volunteers to give one-to-one
reading practice to children in

reading, thereby also giving
them the skills and confidence
to make the most of life.
